2009 - 2010 Scorekeeper Test A

Exam Instructions and Information: Read each question thoroughly and answer each question on the attached answer sheet using current 2009-11 USA Volleyball Domestic Competition Regulations and the Scorekeeping Instructions (pages 126-175). “Team S” refers to the serving team and “Team R” refers to the receiving team. When a team’s serve or receive status is not relevant to the question, “Team A” or “Team B” is used to differentiate the teams. Assume there are no other conditions than those specifically mentioned in the question.

For questions 1 through 34, read each situation carefully and indicate whether the statement and/or action taken by the officials is Correct or Incorrect:

1. When completing the Officials section of the sheet, the names are entered last name, then first initial, using all upper-case letters (i.e., SMITH, J).

2. When recording the team letter designation (A or B) at the beginning of each set, the team on the left is always A.

3. The scorekeeper notices that Team A’s head coach has not indicated a Libero on the line-up sheet. The scorekeeper should ask the second referee to take the line-up sheet back to Team A’s coach to confirm that there is no Libero in the set before entering the line-up on the score sheet.

4. The scorekeeper notices that Team A’s head coach has indicated that Player #13, the Libero, is the game captain. The scorekeeper writes a “c” after #13.
